Abstract

Universities that are healthy, comfortable, safe, and free from sexual violence will ensure the continuity of educational activities. This article focuses on describing the non-sexual violence values developed by universities in their academic culture. This qualitative research was conducted at Universitas Negeri Malang (UM), Universitas Sumatera Utara (USU) and Universitas Palangkaraya (UPR). Data was collected through surveys, in-depth interviews, focus group discussions (FGD), secondary data review, and observation. The results of the study showed that universities have developed non-sexual values by strengthening the governance of higher education institutions and the culture of the community of students, educators, and educational staff.

INTRODUCTION

Sexual violence that happens in Indonesian universities is often considered trivial and receive little attention. Stakeholders involved in universities management seem to be tolerant of the cases. This is inconsistent with the nature of the academic community, which should promote transparency and empathy towards scandals that undermine human rights. Indonesia's National Women's Commission reported that between 2015-2020, 27% of sexual violence cases reported by educational institutions occurred in universities. Indonesia's Ministry of Education, Culture, Research and Technology conducted a survey on sexual violence in 2020 and found that 77% of respondents admitted that sexual violence had occurred on their campus and 63% of victims had not reported their cases (Hendayana, 2020). These findings suggest that the rate of sexual violence in tertiary institutions in Indonesia is concerning. In addition, most campuses in Indonesia have not treated sexual abuse seriously. It, thus, has damaged the image
